Topics: applications and importance of mathematics, sub-areas of mathematics and their interconnectedness, tracks in the math major at UWG, careers in mathematics and how to prepare for them.

Learning Outcomes: Students will be able to

1. Identify the major areas of mathematics (L5, L6)
2. Communicate various mathematical topics and ideas (L4)
3. Identify the different career tracks in the mathematical sciences (L5,L6)
4. Describe the various inter-relationships among the broad areas of mathematics, and between mathematics and other disciplines (L5,L6)
5. Identify strategies for problem solving, and apply basic mathematical techniques to solve specific elementary mathematical problems (L2,L9)
